
Attendance News

We have two weeks holiday this October so that is a perfect time to take holidays when other schools will still be open. EVERY DAY COUNTS



On Tuesday we enjoyed another music lesson now creating our own body percussion patterns. On Wednesday we welcomed Jo from ICECATS who showed us lots of fun games and helped us learn how to be safe. We got to become hedgehogs, superheroes and even learnt how to make a safe line to help guide each other out of school. I have seen some amazing maths work this week from both reception and year 1 recognising and ordering numbers correctly, using resources sensibly to help them too! Another brilliant week everybody, well done and keep up the great work!

This week in Hawk Owls, we have really focused on adding details to our English plans, ready for the final write of a setting description next week. We are thinking about all of the writer's knowledge that we need to include, and have been trying very hard to ensure we are joining our letters. In Maths we continue to look at partitioning with a focus on non-standard methods this week. We were lucky enough to have ICE CATS training on Wednesday, where the children all learnt how to be safe in an emergency situation. This was through games in the classroom. In Music the children have been learning about Disco music with a focus on ABBA! They listened to identify the different instruments they could hear, the different parts of the songs and thought about why they did or didn't like it. We have now fully started all of our foundation subjects, thinking about events in living memory and before living memory in History, the different food groups in Science, how Christians believe God created the World in R.E. and how to stay safe online in computing.

We have had a busy week in Desert Owls this week! In maths, the children have been placing numbers on a number line, this has supported the children as we have moved onto rounding 6- and 7-digit numbers. Next week, we will continue our place value unit and we will be focusing on negative numbers. In English, the children have planned and started to write their narrative. The children have made a great start and have impressed

us with their vocabulary and stamina for writing. Watch out on Twitter for updates! The highlight of the week has to be our ICE CATs training on Wednesday. This involved the children learning about how to stay safe in an emergency and different hand signals to follow. The children then put this into practise when we had a fire alarm test. In geography, the children have been learning about the oceans and continents. Their knowledge was then tested with a Kahoot quiz which all the children enjoyed. Arithmetic's club started this week and aims to build up the children's speed at answering questions, there is still spaces available if you would like your child to attend just speak to a member of the classroom team.

They have been learning about the different parts of a book and the author of a book, before looking at the characters inside the book. They have been describing the main characters of the book, Norman and Amelia. They have also begun their history topic, all about the difference between the past and the present. Children learnt what the words 'past' and 'present' meant before moving onto their geography learning. In Geography, they have looked at locational work based on where they live. They have learnt about different types of houses, their street name, their village or town, and the county they live in. Great work this week!
