This week's school attendance is: 87%



Barn Owls have continued to have fun in nursery. We have been learning to come together as a group and joining in with our morning routine songs. We have also enjoyed having snack time together as a group. We have been trying hard to use our manners of 'please' and 'thank you'. This week Snowy Owls have been working hard to complete all of their tasks! In Maths Reception have been working on their numbers to 5 and recognising the digits. In Year 1 they have been focusing on finding one more and one less of numbers up to 10. We have also shown great maths skills in our outdoor area this week, counting the amount of each exercise we did, counting hits with a bat and ball, drawing numicon and matching with correct digits too! In Science this week we have been learning all the names for our body parts and labelling them! Children also showed a great understanding of their senses from the previous week and linked their learning to the body parts we use for each sense! Well done everyone! Miss Sands

In Hawk Owls this week, we were able to complete our setting descriptions in English. In Maths we have looked at finding 10/100/1000 more or less than a given number, and celebrated European day of Languages on Tuesday with an escape room activity, we managed to crack the code! In History we have started to find out all about The Great Fire of London, looking at the key facts that we need to remember. Can the children tell you the date that it started and how long before it was put out? In Art we have looked at tonal shading of objects, and then completed a study of ancient Egyptian art with a focus on the eye of Horus. We became movie stars as we took part in the recording for our school film for the website. We will let you know when the premiere is!

#### **Miss Curtis**

This week has been a fantastic week in Desert Owls. The children have been really engaged and focused while writing their narrative. They have used some fantastic vocabulary and some children have added a lot of detail when describing how the monster was defeated! In maths, the children have come to the end of the place value unit and are ready to start addition and subtraction next week. We have been completing 20 fluency questions at the start of the day as the children come in so they can build up their speed when solving arithmetic questions. In history, Desert Owls have been investigating the types of houses that the ancient romans lived in. They then discussed what type of house they would like to live in. The highlight of the week had to be our filming day on Tuesday! We showcased history, geography, science, music and reading in our class and we can't wait to see the final piece. Mrs Price

# THE GOLDEN LOCK AWARD

We are introducing a new award to our celebration assembly on a Monday morning to celebrate the amount of children that travel to school on their bikes and their scooters called the Golden Lock award. We are hoping that this will encourage children to want to travel to school in an active manner where possible.

How the golden lock scheme works:

- Have your child travel to school on a bike or a scooter as often as you canif you cannot travel this way because of the distance away you live, parking further down Ship Street and biking or scooting up to school would also work.
- 2. Store your child's bike or scooter in our bike store near the bottom gate.
- 3. On a random day each week, a child from our eco- committee will go and place a big laminated golden padlock on a bike or scooter.
- 4. At the end of the day, if your child's bike or scooter has the golden lock, ask them to take it to Miss Pemberton.
- 5. Your child will then receive the golden lock certificate in our celebration assembly on a Monday morning.
- 6. At the end of each term, a prize will be given to the child who has received the most golden lock awards
