A huge well done to a group of our Y6 children who attended Helsby High School this week and took part in the Big Maths event. They represented our school very well.



I have confirmed the booking with KCR coaching who will deliver a football camp for two days during the February half term. We finish school on Friday 9th February.

CLICKVIEW

With money raised from the last Bingo night we have purchased the online app ClickView.

ClickView has a bank of educational videos, TV documentaries, Newsround and also allows continued access to the Disney Channel. Children can explore ClickView independently as all clips on there will be age appropriate and are curated to only allow children to watch things within their age limit. Videos link to all areas of the National Curriculum but also allows children time to watch things of interest to them personally. Videos such as Beauty and the Beast, Nemo and Home Alone are all available on ClickView. Educationally, children can also consolidate their learning on adjectives, verbs, nouns and mathematical concepts. Children can watch clips about their favourite history topic or learn about the wider world though geography linked clips. If there is something you find your child struggles with at home, type into the search bar and try and find a linked video for children to watch. Many of the clips are interactive with questions for the children to answer as they go through.

This week, teachers have set homework on ClickView for each child. You should see this in your child's dashboard when they log in.

Children should all have come home with their log in details so that they can access this from home. We hope you enjoy!

If you have any problems accessing from home, please call into school and a teacher will demonstrate how to set it up.

Learning this week...

This week Snowy Owls have been working hard to order our class story and create storyboards They have also been writing sentences about each part of the story too. In Maths this week Reception have been looking at finding 1 more and 1 less than a number within 10. They have been using lots of different resources to help them and showed how they can record their answers in different ways too. Year 1 have been recapping their number bonds to and within 10 but thinking about the subtraction facts related to each number bond. They did really well at remembering how to work systematically. In History we have been recapping our learning on changes that have happened in schools, homes and transport over time. In PE the children have been developing their balances and making different sequences in their partners. Our PE specialist has been really impressed with the outcomes of these. Well done everyone!

This week in Hawk Owls, we have planned our 'Invention Narratives' ready to write them next week. The children have paragraphed their ideas, thought of fronted adverbials and varied their pronouns that they will include. In Maths we have started to look at multiplying and dividing by 100 and scaling multiplication questions up or down to known facts to help us solve them. The children thoroughly enjoyed their Art lesson this week, creating their own 'grotesque' sculptures out of clay. They took inspiration from gargoyles and used various techniques to attach the clay. In Science, we have looked at properties of materials and why certain materials are chosen to make certain objects. In History we have focused on the Stone Age, finding out all about how they made their tools, what they used to make houses and how they started to settle near rivers. In PSHE, Mrs Callaghan showed the children how much sugar was in types of food, the children were amazed at how much sugar was in a muffin!

This week in Desert Owls, we have started our booster sessions for Year 6 and the children who attended have enjoyed the early morning maths session as well as the additional session afterschool. We have continued our work on

fractions this week and have been using fraction walls to support the children's understanding. Despite earlier reservations about fractions we have had comments such as 'oh this is easy' and a few lightbulb moments which has been lovely to see. In English, we have started to write our flashback narratives and the children have all been using some amazing vocabulary. We can't wait to finish them next week and then write them up for display. In Science, we have been testing different substances solubility. We tried to ensure that we could make it a fait test and we tested a number of different substances.

We had 4 of our Year 6 pupils visit Helsby High School to represent our school at a Big Maths competition against other local primary schools. The children did incredibly well and worked well as a team.

Don't forget next week we have out SATs information session for our Year 6 parents on **Tuesday 23**rd **January at 3:30pm.** In this session a lot of information will be shared with regards to sitting the SATs papers as well as how you can further support your child at home.

environment that's suitable for ýoung children. This app is easily accessible and avaiĺable for mobile devices, which can be downloaded without needing the YouTube app on the device. Despite YouTube
Kids seeming like a very child-friendly platform, it has raised concerns over its advertising and inappropriate content seeping through the curation process.

Download the YouTube Kids app and connect your own YouTube channel.

SETTING

Input your child's name, age and birth month.

Select the types of videos you want to include for your child based on their age and your own personal choice.

If you decide to approve the content yourself, the app will present you with sample videos for you to accept and reject.

Once you've made your choice, you're ready to use the app!















REMOVE ADVERTISEMENTS

Like YouTube, adverts on YouTube Kids are also quite pervasive. If you decide you don't want your child being exposed to adverts, you can subscribe to YouTube Premium which will remove adverts on YouTube Kids. However, it's worth remembering that this doesn't block adverts that content creators decide to make as part of their content, and children are still able to access channels from branded fast food or toy companies.

RESTRICT VIEWING TIME

YouTube Kids has a far lower chance of showing unsuitable material than YouTube, but there are still reports of malicious users deliberately uploading inappropriate content. It's important that your child feels able to talk to you if they were ever exposed to upsetting content in the future. It's also safest to report inappropriate videos: tap the three dots in the corner of the video and select 'Report'. MONITOR WATCH HISTORY

BE WARY OF UNSUITABLE CONTENT

DISABLE SEARCH OPTION

YouTube Kids allows you to disable the search feature, which you may find useful in preventing your child from unintentionally finding age-inappropriate content. Doing this will also give you more control over what your child is watching. It's also worth noting that setting an age limit will ensure that your child is only exposed to recommended videos that are deemed suitable for their age group.
